CHAP. 216.

Bond required

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the aforesaid commissioners to cause a bond with approved security, to be given in double the amount of the contract for the true and faithful performance of the work, and the said bond to be lodged with the levy court of said county.

Compensation

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the levy court of Kent county, in their discretion, allow to each of said commissioners two dollars per day for each day they may be necessarily employed in executing the duties imposed on them by this act.

Levy directed

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the levy court of Kent county be, and they are hereby authorised, at their discretion, to levy upon the assessable property of said county the amount of expenses incurred under this law, and the same to pay over to the person or persons entitled thereto.

CHAPTER 216.

Passed Mar. 30,
1837.

An act to authorise the Clerk of Kent County Court to record a certain instrument of writing therein mentioned, and to make the same valid.

Record directed

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the clerk of Kent county court be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to record a certain instrument of writing executed and acknowledged on the fifteenth day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-four, between a certain Joel G. Newnam, of Kent county, State of Maryland, and a certain George N. Newnam, of Queen Anne's county and State aforesaid.

Made valid

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That from and after the actual record of said instrument of writing, between the aforesaid Joel G. Newnam and George N. Newnam, it shall be good and operative to confirm the said instrument of writing above mentioned according to the true intent and meaning of said instrument of writing.
