Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Insolvent
That any judge of the orphans' court of Washington
county, be, and he is hereby authorised and required
to grant to James B. Wager, of Harper's Ferry in the
State of Virginia, the benefit of the several acts of
Assembly, passed for the relief of insolvent debtors;
provided, that the said James B. Wager comply with
the provisions of the said insolvent laws in all respects,
except proving his residence for two years preceding
his application, and except also proving that he is in
actual confinement.
