

CHAPTER 47.

CHAP. 48.

An act to divorce Elizabeth Bomgardner of Frederick county, from her husband Henry Bomgardner. Passed Feb. 2, 1837.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly* Divorce.
of Maryland, That the marriage heretofore solemnized between Elizabeth Bomgardner of Frederick county, and Henry Bomgardner, be, and the same is hereby declared to be null and void, to all intents and purposes, and that the said Elizabeth Bomgardner, and Henry Bomgardner, be, and they are hereby divorced a *vinculo matrimonii*.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Henry Bomgardner, by virtue of his marriage with the said Elizabeth Bomgardner, shall not be authorized to have or claim any right, title or interest in the estate, real personal or mixed of the said Elizabeth Bomgardner, that shall be acquired by her after the passage of this act, nor shall the said Elizabeth Bomgardner be entitled in any manner to have or claim any right, title or interest in the estate, real personal or mixed of the said Henry Bomgardner, that shall be acquired by him after the passage of this act. All claims annulled.

CHAPTER 48.

An act to incorporate the Friendship Beneficial Society of Baltimore. Passed Feb. 2, 1837.

WHEREAS, George Evans, Joshua Vansant, Joel Jones, Nathaniel Hall, James Lounds, and others, have formed themselves into a society for the laudable purpose of affording relief to each other, and their respective families, in the event of sickness and death, and have prayed an act of incorporation, that they may the better execute their intentions, and the legislature being desirous of promoting such useful institutions:—
