Resolved, That the Governor and Council, be, and they are hereby authorised in their discretion to employ additional Counsel to aid the Attorney General in the conduct of all actions, civil or criminal, which he may deem expedient, to be instituted against all, or any person or persons, whatsoever, for the purpose of enforcing the execution of the aforesaid act, entitled, an act to regulate sales by public auction.

Resolved, That all expenses which may be incurred in virtue of the foregoing resolutions, shall be payable out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury.
