

court in the year aforesaid; and *whereas*, the said Samuel Warnick failed to make his appearance at said term of said court, and his securities became liable to the State of Maryland for the amount of the said bond of recognizance; and *whereas*, it is represented to this General Assembly that petitions have been forwarded to the Executive of this State, numerous and respectably signed by the citizens of Allegany county, praying that the executive may remit the amount of the bond thus forfeited to the State; and *whereas*, we have abundant reason for believing that the said amount, so forfeited, would have been remitted by the executive aforesaid, had it not been for a slight informality in the signature of one of the judges who signed the petition of said securities; and *whereas*, we believe that the said signature will be made in such form hereafter as will secure the object contemplated by the petitioners, Therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Sheriff of Allegany county be, and he hereby is requested, and directed to suspend all process against said securities in the bond of recognizance of the said Samuel Warnick, for twelve months from and after the passage of this resolution.
