Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Executive be, and they are hereby authorised to pay to the commanding officers, or their order, on the presentation of a muster roll, legally authenticated, the sum or sums of money which may be due the troops for their services, who were called out to quell the riots on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal.

Resolution in favor of John Holland.

Passed Mar. 13, 1837.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby authorised directed to pay to John Holland, or order, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the half pay of a private during his life, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.
