

above mentioned, and will be advantageous to said children. CHAP. 67.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the orphans' court Trustees' bond, &c. may appoint a trustee, and take bond and security from such trustee, payable to the State of Maryland, for the sale of such part of the real estate as they may order to be sold, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust and payment over of the money arising therefrom, as the said court may direct, as hereinafter provided, which said bond shall enure to the use, and be subject to be put in suit by any person interested in the performance of the trust aforesaid.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the negro or negroes Negroes not to be sold out of the State to be sold under the provisions of this act, shall not be sold out of the State of Maryland; and that the purchaser or purchasers shall take the same, subject to the contingent right of the said negro or negroes to their freedom under said will; and the proceeds of sale of the real and personal property shall be divided between the widow and children of said John F. Wheeler, according to the value of their respective interests in the same, as established by the rules of the chancery court of this State: and the said orphans' court shall require bond Bond of Guardian and security of the guardian of said children conditioned for the true and faithful application of the portions of the said children, according to the order of said court.

CHAPTER 67.

An act supplemental to an act, entitled, an act to authorise the appointment of Commissioners, and the division of Charles County into School Districts. Passed Jan. 21 1857.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall be the duty of the levy court of Charles county, at their next April session, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, to appoint three suitable and discreet persons in each election district in Charles county to act as commissioners, whose duty it shall be, or a majority of them, to assemble in their respective election districts at some convenient place on or before the first Monday in September next, and Commissioners to divide
