CHAPTER 7.

Passed Jan. 9, 1837. *An act to divorce Harriet Ridgely, of Baltimore County, from her husband, Greenbury Ridgely.*

Divorce.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the marriage heretofore solemnized between Harriet Ridgely, of Baltimore county, and Greenbury Ridgely, her husband, be and the same is hereby declared null and void, and that the said Harriet Ridgely and Greenbury Ridgely, be and they are hereby divorced, a vinculo matrimonii.*

Guardianship.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted, That said Harriet Ridgely be, and she is hereby declared to be entitled to the guardianship of her child or children by her marriage with said Ridgely.*

CHAPTER 8.

Passed Jan. 9, 1837. *A further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to provide for electing Commissioners for Washington County and prescribing their powers and duties.*

Power to collect costs &c.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Washington county shall have full power and authority to collect in the same manner that all other debts or charges are now collected, the costs in all cases that have heretofore accrued or that may hereafter accrue, and be chargeable against individuals on petition for public roads, where by the return of the examiners or the decision of the commissioners, the costs shall or have fallen on the petitioners.

Levy directed.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Baltimore county be, and they are hereby authorised and directed to levy upon the assessable property of Baltimore county, such sum as they shall deem reasonable, not exceeding
