CHAP. 11.

CHAPTER 10.

*An act authorising and requiring the Commissioners of Washington county, to levy at their next annual levy a sufficient sum in advance to pay Jurors and State Witnesses in said county.* Passed Jan. 10, 1837.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Commissioners of Washington county, be, and they are hereby authorised and required to levy on the assessable property of said county at their next annual levy, in addition to the amount now required by law, and annually thereafter, a sufficient sum in advance, to pay jurors and State witnesses in said county, promptly at the close of each term of the said county court. Levy in advance directed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the collector of said county, whenever any person shall present to him an order from the clerk of Washington county court for his attendance as a juror or State witness, at any time after the close of the November term in eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, to pay over to such person or his order the amount due him, after deducting therefrom all charges the collector may have against such jurors or witnesses. Collector required to pay certificates.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the clerk of Washington county court is hereby required to furnish each juror with an order for the amount of his per diem in the same manner that orders are now granted to witnesses. Order for per diem.
