And be it enacted, That all conveyances of real property in Carroll county, made and executed since the confirmation of the act establishing said county, shall be as good and valid to all intents and purposes whatever, if enrolled amongst the records of said county within six months after the appointment of a clerk in said county, as if they had been enrolled within six months from their execution and delivery; and all conveyances of personal property in said county required by law to be recorded, shall be as good and valid, to all intents and purposes whatever, if recorded among the said records within twenty days from the appointment of a clerk for said county, as if recorded within twenty days from their execution and delivery.
