## CHAPTER 49.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 115 of Offutt's Code of the Public Local Laws of Baltimore County, published in 1916, and to repeal Sections 116 and 117 of said Code, title "County Commissioners," changing the number of County Commissioners of Baltimore County, and providing for their election.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 15 of Offutt's Code of the Public Local Laws of Baltimore County, published in 1916, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows, to wit:

Section 115. On and after the expiration of the term for which the present incumbents were elected there shall be three County Commissioners of Baltimore County, who shall hold office for the term of four years and shall be eligible for re-election. They shall be elected at the general election next preceding the expiration of the term of the present incumbents. They shall each receive an annual salary of twentyfour hundred dollars and no more for any purpose whatsoever, payable monthly by the Treasurer of said county; and they are required to meet for the transaction of public business, at their office at Towson, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each week, and as much oftener as a proper discharge of their official duties may require; and they shall meet daily from the first Tuesday in November in each year until the annual levy is made. Said Board of County Commissioners shall perform all the duties of the Highways Commission of Baltimore County, and shall have all and singular the powers and authority conferred upon the Highways Commission of Baltimore County by Chapter 465 of the Acts of 1904 and the several amendments and supplements thereto.

SECTION 2. And be it further enacted, That Sections 116 and 117 of Offutt's Code of the Public Local Laws of Baltimore County published in 1916 be and the same are hereby repealed.
