on said bonds and to create a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity until the last of said bonds issued under this Act Such funds shall be shall have been paid and cancelled. deposited in some safe banking or savings institution in the State of Maryland, on interest, and the County Commissioners are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase from the proceeds of such sinking funds any of the bonds which may be offered for sale when, in their judgment, it shall be advisable so to do, and upon the purchase of any of such bonds and the redemption of the same at maturity the County Commissioners shall immediately cancel said bond or bonds by stamping the same with the word "Cancelled." No portion of said sinking funds shall ever be diverted to any other purpose than to the liquidation of said bonds, and in case any of the persons in charge thereof so divert or permit the same to be diverted they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than twice the amount so diverted.

SEC. 6. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1920.

## CHAPTER 590.

AN ACT to incorporate the Town of Indian Head, in Charles County, Maryland.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the citizens of the town of Indian Head, in Charles County, Maryland, be and they are hereby created a body corporate, in the name of the Town Commissioners of Indian Head, with all the powers and privileges of a body politic and corporate, and by said corporate name may have perpetual succession, sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded against in any Court of law or equity in said county, and may have and use a common seal.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That the corporate limits of said town of Indian Head shall be as follows: Beginning at the bound-stone near the Indian Head Town Hall, marking one end of the boundary line of the U. S. Government Reservation and dividing the same from the land of Francis E. Mattingly, and running thence, continuing the course of said line,
