

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted,* That said board shall meet upon call of the chairman, and a majority of the board is hereby constituted a quorum for the transaction of business.

SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted,* That the rules and regulations of this board shall be enforced by the chairman thereof, operating by and through a State system of boiler inspection, or by and through such other or supplementary machinery as may be created for that purpose either by the board itself, or by any Act of the General Assembly of Maryland; and the chairman of the board shall make provision therefor in the regular departmental estimates. Nothing in this Act, however, shall be construed as investing said board with power to adopt or enforce any rules or regulations governing the "operation" of said boilers or fixing the requirements or qualifications of persons legally entitled to operate any said boilers, unless said power is specially conferred upon said board by some subsequent Act of the General Assembly.

SEC. 6. *And be it further enacted,* That nothing in this Act shall be construed as in any wise affecting any existent laws relative to boiler inspection; except that no boiler which shall be installed in the future shall be passed by any boiler inspector which does not measure up to the rules and regulations established by the "Board of Boiler Rules," nor shall any future installed boiler be considered legally permissible in Maryland unless constructed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the "Board of Boiler Rules."

SEC. 7. *And be it further enacted,* That the rules formulated by the "Board of Boiler Rules" shall become effective and binding on manufacturers and other users of boilers on January 1st, 1921.

SEC. 8. *And be it further enacted,* That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Act, or any person, firm or corporation violating any of the rules, regulations or requirements of the "Board of Boiler Rules," shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) or to imprisonment for not less than thirty days and not more than two years; or by both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.
