To the sale, grant and conveyance by Charles Schmidt, Trustee, to the Trustee of the Harlem Park Methodist Episcopal Church of Baltimore City, of a certain lot of ground and premises in Baltimore City, State of Maryland, by deed dated September 30, 1919, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore City in Liber S. C. L. No. 3453, folio 367, etc.

CHAPTER 347.

AN ACT to authorize the State Roads Commission of Maryland to build an improved State road from Waterloo on the Washington-Baltimore Boulevard in Howard County, through the town of Jessups to a point on the concrete road from Severn to Camp Meade in Anne Arundel County.

CHAPTER 348.

AN ACT to repeal Chapter 532 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the January Session, 1900, as now codified in Section 249 of Article 27 of Bagby's Annotated Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Health-Milk-Pure Skimmed," and to re-enact the same with amendments.
