

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a new section to be known as Section 11-A be added to Article 81 of the Annotated Code of Public General Laws, title "Revenue and Taxes," sub-title "Mode of Valuation and Assessment," the same to read as follows:

11-A. Every automobile dealer in this State shall within ten days after the expiration of the quarters ending respectively on the last day of March, June, September and December in each year transmit to the County Commissioners of the county in which such dealer has his principal place of business where such is in one of the counties of this State, and to the Appeal Tax Court of Baltimore, where such principal place of business is in Baltimore City, a full and complete list of all motor vehicles, including motor trucks, sold by such dealer within the preceding quarter, together with the name and address of the vendee in all instances and the price for which such motor vehicle was sold, in the case of a sale, or the amount at which it was valued in the case of an exchange. Any automobile dealer failing to perform the duties imposed by this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to indictment and on conviction shall be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1920.

CHAPTER 423.

AN ACT to correct a clerical error or misprint in Chapter 283 of the Laws of 1894 of the State of Maryland, entitled "An Act to repeal Chapter 421 of the Laws of 1892, and Sections 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, and 54, of Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Carroll County," sub-title "Hamstead," and to re-enact said sections with amendments and to add additional sections thereto," by amending said Act so that wherever the incorrect spelling "Hamstead" is found in said Act the word "Hampstead" shall be understood to be meant; and to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 40, 54-A and 54-D of the said Chapter 283 of the Laws of 1894, and to add additional sections to Article
