

Executive Department, and upon its transmission to the Comptroller the appropriation for such department shall be paid out in accordance with such amended schedule.

Any department, board, commission, institution or officer may at any time submit in writing to the Governor an amended schedule for the disbursement and apportionment of the appropriations made to it or him. If the Governor shall approve such amended schedule he shall transmit the same, with his certificate of approval, to the Comptroller and thereafter such appropriations shall be paid out in accordance with said amended schedule. Any such amended schedule so submitted to the Governor may be withdrawn at any time before the Governor has acted thereon. Any amended schedule approved by the Governor may be again amended at any time in like manner and with like effect. All amendments and schedules made or approved by the Governor shall be reported by him to the next session of the General Assembly.

SECTION 8. *And be it further enacted,* That after the payment of the specific appropriations hereinafter listed and made, there is hereby appropriated out of any excess in the State Treasury during the two fiscal years ending September 30th, 1922, the sum of \$100,000.00 for the use of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1920, if called in special session only, or for the use of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1922, said sum to be used solely for emergencies which could not be foreseen at the time of the enactment hereof and which require, for the welfare or safety of the State, the expenditure of money which would not otherwise be available, and to be disbursed only in accordance with the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly enacted in the usual manner.
