of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of CHAP. 94. assembly passed for the relief of insolvent debtors, provided the said Victor D. Montalt, shall in all respects, (except that of proving residence,) comply with the requisitions of said acts of assembly, and that he satisfy the said commissioners that he did not come into this state with the view of obtaining the benefit of the said insolvent laws.

## CHAP. XCV.

An Act relating to the owners and occupants of the Passed Mar & 1825 Shad, Herring, and Ale-Wife Fisheries in any of the

waters of this State.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Ma-cierks may g ruland, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall be the der of the clerk of any county court in this state, as and he is ereby authorised and required, upon application being made by any person within his county, to grant a license for two calendar months to sell spirituous liquors, and other articles, during the season for catching said fish, prowided the owner or occupant of such fisheries shall be engaged in catching said fish for sale.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted. That the said clerks shall charge for grantcharge and receive for such license the sum of six dollars, and such license shall be granted in the same manner, and

upon the same conditions, as are now prescribed by law.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the clerks of the several county courts in this state, and the clerk of the city court of Baltimore, be and they are hereby authorised and required, upon application, to grant a license to sell spirituous liquors at any horse-race, or militia muster, and the said clerk shall charge and receive three dollars for each and every day such license is granted.

CHAP. XCVI.

An Act relating to the Alms or Work-House, of Dor-Panel Mars, 1280 chester County.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Ma-Almaryland, That the justices of the levy court of Dorchester county, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorised, empowered and directed, (if they shall deem it expedient and proper for the amelioration of the condition of the poor in said county,) to sell and dispose, to the best possible advantage, the present alms and work-house establishment, with the lands thereunto belonging, in said county, at such time, and in such manner, as the benefit and ac-
