Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That a justice of the peace Judges of elections for the time being, residing in or near Abingdon, shall appoint, by writing under his hand and seal, one judge to hold the first election for burgess and commissioners, and the said judge shall conduct the said election in the manner in which the judges of an election district are now by law directed to hold an election for delegates to the general assembly, as far as may be consistent with the other provisions of this act; and the said judge shall make return, under his hand and seal, of the persons elected as burgess and commissioners, to the clerk of Harford county, to be by him safely kent;
