That the commissioners of Baltimore county be and make report they are hereby authorised to appoint three discreet and disinterested persons to view said bridge, and report to the commissioners of said county the probable expense of repairing the same, and if in the judgment of the commissioners asaforesaid, they shall deem it necessary to levy a further sum sufficient for the repairing of said bridge, not exeeeding three hundred dollars, they are hereby authorised to levy the same on the assessable property of said county. and have it collected and paid over for that purpose.
