CHAP. CXLI.

An Act for the repairing of a Bridge over the Main Falls of Patapsco, on the Liberty Road, in Baltimore County. Passed Mar 9, 1829

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, that the bridge over the Main Falls of Patapsco, on the Liberty road, in Baltimore county, is now in a state of dilapidation; therefore, Preamble

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioners of Baltimore county be and they are hereby authorised to appoint three discreet and disinterested persons to view said bridge, and report to the commissioners of said county the probable expense of repairing the same, and if in the judgment of the commissioners as aforesaid, they shall deem it necessary to levy a further sum sufficient for the repairing of said bridge, not exceeding three hundred dollars, they are hereby authorised to levy the same on the assessable property of said county, and have it collected and paid over for that purpose. Persons to view said bridge and make report

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That when the said county commissioners shall have received the report of three persons as herein before mentioned, they shall then give notice that they will receive proposals for contracting for the repairing of the said bridge, and shall cause the same to be repaired, with good and substantial materials, if they in their judgment shall deem the same to be proper. When report is made proposals to be received, &c

CHAP. CXLI.

An Act incorporating a Company for the Improvement of the Public Road from the City of Frederick to Harper's Ferry. Passed Mar 9, 1829

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That a company shall be incorporated to make a public road from Frederick to Harper's Ferry, commencing for the same at the west end of the city of Frederick, at the turnpike road, and about thirty feet west of the north west corner of Col. Stephen Steiner's new brick dwelling house, and running thence by and with the courses and distances marked for the route of the turnpike road from Frederick to Harper's-Ferry, or as near thereto as the president and managers of the company may in their judgment think expedient, as located by Lawrence Brengle, Henry Kemp, Company to be incorporated
