CHAP. CXLIX.

An Act to repeal certain parts of Acts therein mentioned, Passed Mar 10,1820 and for other purposes.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Ma-swine ryland. That it shall be lawful for the owner or possessor of b of any land or ground, within five miles of the bounds of the beimp city of Baltimore, to seize and impound, or cause to be seized and impounded, any hog or other swine, found trespassing on such land or ground, and the same to retain for such period as the person so trespassed on may think proper, giving such swine, while so impounded, necessary food and drink; unless the owner of such swine shall pay, or tender, to the person so trespassed on, or to his agent having charge of, or being on, the land or ground trespassed on, the sum of fifty cents for each hog, or other swine, and also ten cents per day for every day every such heg, or other swine, shall have been so impounded and fed, up to and including the day of such tender of payment.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That any person damaged by bereit any trespass committed by any hog, hogs, or other swine, the so impounded as aforesaid, to a greater value than fifty cents,
