CHAP. 172.

*An Act to divorce Sarah Sandman, and her Husband Jacob Sandman, of Washington County.*

Passed Mar 12, 1828

Divorced

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the said Sarah Sandman be and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual cohabitation, with her husband Jacob Sandman.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Jacob Sandman shall not by virtue of his marriage with the said Sarah Sandman, be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said Sarah Sandman, to be by her acquired after the passage of this act, nor shall Sarah Sandman be authorised to have or claim any right or interest in the estate real, personal or mixed, of the said Jacob Sandman, to be by him acquired after the passage of this act.

Property hereafter acquired by either

Sec. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said Sarah Sandman shall have and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities, and be subject to all the legal responsibilities, of a *feme sole*, in the same manner she would have been if she had never been married.

Sarah to exercise rights of a feme sole

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the said Jacob Sandman shall not be liable for any debt to be hereafter contracted by the said Sarah Sandman.

Jacob not liable for debts hereafter contracted by her

CHAP. CLXXIII.

*A Supplement to an Act, entitled, An act for the relief of the Poor of Queen-Anne's County.*

Passed Mar 12, 1828

WHEREAS persons received into the alms and work house of Queen-Anne's county, are sometimes possessed of inconsiderable portions of property, real or personal, and it seems reasonable that the profits to be derived from such property should be applied to the use of the public, so long as the owners thereof are supported by the county; therefore,

Preamble

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the trustees for the poor of Queen-Anne's county be invested with full power and authority to take into their care and possession, all the property, real or personal, of any person who has been admitted, or shall hereafter be admitted, into the alms and work house of the said county, and the same to possess, occupy and use, and the profits thereof to apply to the maintenance and support of the poor of Queen-Anne's county, which authority and power shall remain with the said trustees over such property, and the profits thereof, as long as the owner of the same shall continue in the said alms and work house.

Property belonging to paupers to be under care of trustees
