

CHAP. CXC.

An Act to make valid a certain Deed of Mortgage therein mentioned.

CHAP. 190.

Passed Mar 13, 1829

WHEREAS it is represented to the general assembly, that a certain John Cooper, of Prince-George's county, did, on the first day of January eighteen hundred and twenty-five, execute a deed of mortgage to a certain Benjamin Duvall, senior, of the county aforesaid: And whereas it appears from the endorsement on said deed of mortgage, signed by the clerk of said county, that the said deed of mortgage was recorded on the seventeenth day of January eighteen hundred and twenty-five, in Liber A B. No. 3, pages four hundred and eighty-three and four hundred and eighty-four: And whereas it also appears that the said deed of mortgage was not acknowledged before two justices of the peace, as the law directs; therefore,

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the said deed of mortgage shall and may be good, to all intents and purposes, as if the said deed of mortgage had been acknowledged agreeable to law, any thing contained therein to the contrary notwithstanding.

CHAP. CXCL.

An Act for the payment of the Journal of Accounts.

WHEREAS it appears by the journal of accounts of this session, that there is due from this state the sum of thirty-seven thousand nine hundred and thirty dollars and ninety-five cents; therefore,

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators, assigns or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of current money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by the said journal of accounts, out of any money now in the treasury, or that shall come into the treasury, subject to the appropriation of the general assembly.

CHAP. CXCLII.

An Act relating to the Sinking Funds of this State.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the last proviso of the fourth section of an act, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the promotion of internal improvement, passed at Decem-
