### No. 35.

A Resolution in favour of Thomas Smith, of the State of Ohio, who was a Soldier of the Revolutionary War. Passed Feb 20, 1829

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Thomas Smith, of the state of Ohio, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of his services during the revolutionary war.

### No. 36.

A Resolution in favour of John Denoon, of the State of Ohio, who was a Soldier of the Revolutionary War. Passed Feb 20, 1829

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John Denoon, of the state of Ohio, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a drummer, as a further remuneration for his services during the revolutionary war.

### No. 37.

A Resolution authorising the Sheriff of Frederick county, to discharge Philip Markley from the Gaol of said County, and for other purposes. Passed Feb 20, 1829

*Resolved*, That the sheriff of Frederick county be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to discharge Philip Markley from gaol, upon the commitment for fine and cost, for the crime of assault and battery; and that the levy court of said county are directed to levy the fine, cost and charges, upon the assessable property of the county.
