

## RESOLUTIONS.

1828

### No. 51.

A Resolution in favour of Andrew Schrach, of the city of Baltimore, in consideration of his services during the Revolutionary War. Passed Mar 12, 1828

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Andrew Schrach, of the city of Baltimore, or to his order, during life, in half yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in consideration of his services during the revolutionary war.

### No. 52.

A Resolution to provide for the payment of the expense incurred for the sawing of wood, for the use of both branches of the Legislature. Passed Mar 12, 1828

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John Quynn, twelve dollars and fifty cents, advanced by him for the hire of a man to saw wood for both branches of the legislature of Maryland.

### No. 53.

A Resolution to compensate Gottlieb I. Grammer, Sergeant at Arms of the House of Delegates, for serving subpoenas on certain Witnesses therein mentioned. Passed Mar 12, 1828

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay to Gottlieb I. Grammer, sergeant at arms of the house of delegates, the sum of fourteen dollars and forty cents, for serving subpoenas on thirty-six witnesses to appear before the committee on elections and privileges, to give evidence in the case of the Annapolis contested election, and before the joint committee on the subject of the chancery records.

### No. 54.

A Resolution providing for the payment of Fielding Lucas, junior, of the city of Baltimore, for Books furnished the State in 1828. Passed Mar 12, 1828

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby au-
