

## CHAP. 9.

is hereby authorized and empowered to remove and bring into this State from the District of Columbia, at any time after the passage of this act, a certain negro slave, named Rachel, and that the removal of said woman slave, to this state, shall not in any manner, entitle her to freedom; Provided, that the said slave, when removed, shall be registered among the records of Baltimore county court, or the records of such county to which she may be removed, within three months after her removal

## Restriction.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That nothing in this act contained, shall be construed to authorize a disposition of said slave, except in cases of disposition by last will and testament, and dispositions by law, for bona fide debts, or consequent upon intestacy, in less than three years after the passage of this act.

## CHAPTER 10.

Passed Jan 12, 1830

*An act to appoint Commissioners for the purpose of dividing Dorchester County into eight separate Election Districts.*

Commissioners named.

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Henry Cook, (Hills point) Hugh Spodden, John Spodden, (Cooks Point) Thomas Applegarth and Levin Jones, Castle Haven, be, and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to lay off Dorchester county into eight separate Election Districts and to number the same.

Elections—location—return—proceed.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That for the creation and establishment of the eighth Election District of Dorchester county, it shall be the duty of said Commissioners or a majority of them, or a majority of the survivors of them, to divide district number seven, or the Cambridge district, into two Election Districts, having a special reference in said division, and the establishment of the eighth Election District, to the convenience of the population of said District, (now known as number seven) inhabiting that part of the county below Cambridge commonly called and known by the name of the neck, and a convenient portion of the said District number seven shall be erected and laid off by the said Commissioners into a separate Election District; and having so divided the said county into eight separate Election Districts, it shall be the duty of said Commissioners to designate a place in each district at which the election shall be held, having regard to the convenience and accommodation of persons attending the elections; and the said Commissioners shall, on, or before the first day of July next, deliver to the Clerk of Dorchester county a Combs' description in writing under their hands and seals of
