

## CHAPTER 121.

## CHAP. 121.

*An act to divorce Martha A. Hollingsworth, from her husband Parkin Hollingsworth.* Passed Feb. 22, 1829

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* Martha A. Hollingsworth, of Baltimore county, be, and she is hereby divorced from bed, board and mutual cohabitation with her husband Parkin Hollingsworth; that she may, and shall henceforth take and be known by the name of Martha A. Kelso; that she shall be entitled to the custody of their daughter; and that the said Martha shall have and exercise all the rights, privileges and immunities and be subject to all the legal responsibilities of a feme sole, except that of marrying again, in the same manner as she would have been if she had never been married; and that the said Parkin Hollingsworth shall not, by virtue of his marriage with the said Martha, be in any manner entitled to, or authorised to have or claim any right, title or interest in the estate, real, personal or mixed, of the said Martha, whether acquired by the said Martha prior to, or to be acquired by her after the passage of this act; nor shall the said Martha be in any manner entitled to have or claim any right, title or interest in the estate, real personal or mixed, of the said Parkin Hollingsworth whether acquired by the said Parkin prior to, or to be acquired by him after the passage of this act; and that neither the said Parkin, nor the said Martha, shall be liable for any debt that may be hereafter contracted by the other.

## CHAPTER 122.

*An act for the relief of David C. French, an Insolvent Debtor.* Passed Feb 22, 1829

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland That* the Commissioners of Insolvent Debtors for the city and county of Baltimore, and the Judges of Baltimore County Court respectively, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant to David C. French, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the several acts of Assembly, passed for the relief of insolvent debtors; *Provided*, that said David C. French, shall in all respects, (except that of proving residence) comply with the requisitions of said acts of Assembly, and that he satisfy the said Commissioners, that he did not come into this State with the view of obtaining the benefit of the said Insolvent laws.
