Sec 2. And be it enucted, That the said Steward to the Oath and bond. CHAPTER 154.

An act to repeal a part of certain Acts therein mentioned.

WHEREAS, the Trustees of the Poor for Baltimore city Preamble. and county, have ample powers, under the existing laws, to grant out-pensions, to all indigent persons in the city and coun-
