church, and shall meet at their usual place of worship on the CHAP, 174, Monday next after the third Sunday that shall be in the month of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eacht hundred and thirty-one, and on the same day in each and every year thereafter, forever, (of which notice shall be given in the said church at the close of divine worship on the morang of the said third Sunday, in the mouth aforesaid,) and then: of there, between the hours of ten o'clock, A. M. and one o'clock, P. M shall choose, by ballot, five tay Trustees of the said church, Election whose time of service shall continue until the next election transshall be made, and a majority of the whole number of votes taken shall be necessary for a choice, and the result of every such election shall, as soon as convenient thereafter, be openly declared by the payor of the said church, and extered in the books of the said corporation, for that purpose to be

kept.

Sec. [5. And be it contend, That it shall and may be law- Transaction and pasful to and for the said Trustees, and their successors, from the powers of time to time, as occasion shall require, to meet together for the purpose of transacting the business of the society under their care, of the time and place of which meetings due notice shall be given to all the said Tru tees at least on day before, at which meetings the pastor of the said church shall be president, and shall be entitled to a vote on every cuestion; and any three of the said by trustees, together with the said pastor, shall form a board or quorant, and the said board of trustees shall have power, by a majority of voices present, to make, ordain and establish such times, orders and regulations, for the management of the temporar business, and disposing of the estate of the said corp ration, as to them shall seem proper; Froeided, that such rules, orders and regulations be not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state.

Sec. [6.] And be it enacted That any member of the said comes board of trustees shall have full nower and authority to adjourn from day to day, until a caorum shall attend; and the said corporation are hereby and outsed and comowered to employ some fit and proper person to act as register, whose duty it shall be to keep a regular account of their proctedings, which shall be subject to the inspection of any of the members of the said corporation.

Sec. [7.] Viherens, a certain Regina Grandadams, late of Preamble. Frederick county, deceased, by her last will and testament, in writing, bearing date on the sixth day of April, eighteen hundred and twelve, and now of record in the office of the Register of Wills of said county, in liber H. S. number two, folio ninety-two, and cetra, did devise and bequeath to the use of the same church hereinbefore mentioned, by the name of "the Roman Chapel near Westminster, on Logdon's land," and to the use of the priest that attends the said chapel, the inter-
