That the Treasure of the Western Shore of Maryland, pay to Rich and Beall sheriff of Alic, any county, the sum of ten dollars, being the amount of a fine improacd on 4 an Dunn, in Allerny county court, at April court eighteen hundred and twenty eight for selling inpoor without licenses, and paid into the treasury by said sherift, but remitted by the Governor and Council affer the payment thereof, by said sherift.

No. 15.

A Resolution directing the investment in Bank Stock, of the money in the treasury, due to Montgomery county, as her portion of the Free School fund.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Wostern Shore, be directed to invest in the stock of such bank in the city of Baltimore, as he may deen nost judicious for the interest of the county, such sum of money as may be due to Montgomery county, as her protino of the free school fund, and now lying in the Treasury of the Western Shore.

Panel Feb 5,1830 A Resolutions in favor of Richard Mackall, late one of the State's Inspectors of Tobacco, in the City of Baltimore.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be, and he is hereby anhorised and directed, if he shall consider it equitable and proper, to allow to Richard Mackall, late inspector of Tobacco in the City of Batimore, a credit on the State's claim against said Mackall, of the sam of three hundred and sixty two dollars and fifty cents, with such interest as may have accurated on that amount, from the date of its preparently senight Bichard Mackall, to Thomas Macyill, ac, clerk in the inspection appreciation, so which the said Fateful Rese statehed.
