session, during the first week thereof, a true and perfect uventory of the furniture beloaging to the Government House, in which shall be distinctly designated the articles found in said House, at the time of the entrance into office of the Governor, and the specific articles, with the cost of each, as purchased under the authority of any order or resolution.

## No. 19.

Panel 7th 1, 1530 A Resolution in favor of Priscilla White, widow of the late James White, who was a Pensioner of the State.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Harding or order, for the use of Priscilla White, widow of the late James White, a pensioner of the State of Maryland, the sum of twenty-twocklars and thirty-three cents, being a balance due said White at the time of his death.

## No. 20.

Panel Peb 9, 1239 A Resolution authorising an appropriation for furniture and repairs of the Government House.

Ranoleed by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby subno-ised and directed to pay to the order of His Excellency the Governor of Maryland, for furniture and repairs of the Government House, the sum of one thousand dollars.

## No. 21.

A Resolution in favor of Sarah Gould, of Dorchester county, widow of the late William Gould, who was a soldier of the Revolutionary War.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Sarah Gould, of Dorohester county, or to her order, during life, in-quanter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further renumeration for the services, rendered by her hasband William Gould, during the revolutionary war.
