A Resolution in favor of Richard W. Gill, Deputy Attorney General for Baltimore county. Passed Feb 27, 1829

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Richard W. Gill, Deputy Attorney General for Baltimore county, or to his order, the sum of two hundred and sixty two dollars and sixteen cents, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, as a compensation for certain professional services rendered the state, in the collection of her revenue.

A Resolution respecting the Trustees of the Poor for the several counties of this state. Passed Feb 27, 1829

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the Governor and Council be requested to furnish the Trustees of the Poor in the several counties of this state, with one copy for each county, of the laws and resolutions annually passed by the General Assembly.
