

**CHAP. 4.** *refuse to call such meeting, the said stockholders, being proprietors of not less than the aforesaid number of shares, shall have power to call a general meeting of the stockholders, giving at least one month's notice in two or more newspapers published in the city of Baltimore, and specifying in such notice the object or objects of such meeting; and the resolutions of stockholders, owners of a majority of all the shares of the company's capital stock, in a general meeting assembled, shall at all times be binding on the company, and their president and directors, if not inconsistent with law, and the provisions of this act.*

**Act to be in force 15 years**

**Sec. 12.** *And be it enacted,* That this act shall continue and be in force for the term of fifteen years, and until the end of the next session of the general assembly which shall happen thereafter.

**Tax on property**

**Sec. 13.** *And be it enacted,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed in anywise to affect the right of the legislature to levy on the real and personal property of said company a tax similar to that which is or may hereafter be levied on the real and personal property within this state.

**CHAP. V.**

**Passed Jan 10, 1829**

*An Act to repeal part of an Act passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-five, and for other purposes.*

**Repeal**

**Sec. 1.** *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the second section of an act, passed at December session eighteen hundred and twenty-five, chapter one hundred and sixty-five, be and the same is hereby repealed.

**Pensions to be paid quarterly**

**Sec. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That the pensions of revolutionary officers and soldiers, and of their widows, shall be paid quarter yearly, on the first days of January, April, July and October.

**Treasurer authorized to pay**

**Sec. 3.** *And be it enacted,* That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorized and directed, to pay to any person on the revolutionary pension list, who may apply for the same in person, or by order, the quarter's pension which became due on the first day of January eighteen hundred and twenty-nine.

*An Act for the construction of a Canal through Frederick County.*
