Sec. 2. And he it enacted. That if any harrel shall have been so damaged, or otherwise defective, as not to admit of its being repaired, it shall be lawful for the owner or owners, his, her or their agent, to substitute a good and sufficient barrel, and pay for the packing of the same or to make such deduction from the flour as may be agreed upon between the vendor and nurchaser: and the inspector inspecting such damaged or defective barrel, shall, under the like penalty as above, certify to what in his opinion, such da-

mage or defect is owing Sec. 3. And he it enacted. That all penalties incurred under the provisions of this act, shall be recovered before any justice of the peace for this state, in the same manner as other small debts are now collected, one half thereof to

the informer, and the other half to the state. Sec. 4 And be it enacted. That all acts or parts of acts. inconsistent with, or repugnant to the provisions of this act. be and the same are hereby renealed.

CHAP. LXXXVIII. Paned Feb 21,1220 An Act Supplementary to an act for the opening of Pratt-Street, passed at December session eighteen hundred and seventeen, chanter seventy-one.

Sec. 1. Be it enucted by the General Assembly of Maed ruland. That from and after the first day of April next, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons whatsoever, to land any wood or lumber, (staves excepted) on that part of Pratt-street commonly called Pratt-street Wharf, which lies between Light street and Franklin Lane.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That if any person or persons shall violate the provisions of the first section of this act, he, she or they, shall be subject to a fine of twenty dollars for every such offence, the one half to go to the informer, and the other half to the state, and that the said fine may be sued for in the name of the state, before any justice of the peace of the city of Baltimore, and the same proceedings had thereon for the recovery, as in the case of suits for the recovery of small debts out of court before justices of the peace.

Return of fine

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of every justice of the peace in the said city to make an annual return to the treasurer of the western shore of all fines imposed by him under this act, and to recover and receive. for the use of the state, the proportion of said fines due to the state, and to account for and pay over the same to the said treasurer at the time of making his said annual return.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the mayor of the city of Baltimore to enforce the provisions of this act in its first section.
