

Sec. 5. *And be it enacted*, That this law shall not be in force or have any operation whatever, unless the same shall have been approved of by the mayor and city council on or before the first day of April next.

CHAP. 88.

Act not to be in force unless approved of, &c.

Sec. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the proviso to the seventh section of the act of one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, chapter seventy-one, be and the same is hereby repealed; and that the wharf referred to in the third proviso, shall in future be under the charge of the state wharfinger, and subject to the same regulations as other state wharves in the city of Baltimore.

Proviso of former act repealed

Sec. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the state wharfinger be and he is hereby authorised to rent any part of the wharf fronting the south end of the state tobacco warehouse, lying between Dugan's and O'Donnell's wharves: *Provided*, the said renting shall not in his opinion, interfere with and delay the landing of tobacco at the state warehouse aforesaid; *Provided also*, that no contract for such renting shall be for a longer period than one year; *And provided further*, that every such contract shall be approved by the governor and council.

Wharf may be rented,

Proviso

Sec. 8. *And be it enacted*, That no vessel shall be charged any wharfage whilst landing any tobacco at the state tobacco warehouse aforesaid, for inspection; *Provided nevertheless*, that nothing in this section contained, shall be construed to sanction the lying of such vessels at the tobacco warehouse wharf aforesaid, for a longer time than the tobacco inspectors shall think reasonable for the landing of said tobacco; *And provided also*, that if any thing, other than tobacco, is landed, or any cargo is taken on board, that wharfage shall be charged, any thing in this section to the contrary notwithstanding.

No wharfage to be charged for landing tobacco, &c

Proviso

Sec. 9. *And be it enacted*, That boats having on board tobacco for the inspection houses aforesaid, shall have a preference given to them over all other boats.

CHAP. LXXXIX.

An Act to authorise the laying out and opening a Road through a part of Frederick, Anne-Arundel, and Montgomery Counties.

Passed Feb 22, 1829

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Joshua Jones, Dennis Poole, and Henry M'Ellfresh, of Frederick county, Henry Wayman, of Anne-Arundel county, William M. Norwood, Ephraim Etchison, and Aden Darbey, of Montgomery county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to survey, lay out and open, a road not exceeding thirty feet in width, in the best and straightest direction, taking all circumstances into con-
