Sec. 7. And be it enacted, That the commissioners here- Dir in before named for Montgomery county, or a majority of in M them, shall be and they hereby are authorised and empowered, to lay out and open a road, not exceeding thirty feet in width, in the best and straightest direction, taking all circumstances into consideration, from the Quaker road before mentioned, near the residence of Henry Griffith of Lyde, by or near Cracklin-town, to intersect the road leading from Seneca Bridge by John Fisher's tavern, near the plantation of Samuel Magruder; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall make out a plat of said road, and return the same to the clerk of Montgomery county court, to be recorded among the records of said county; and the said road, when so opened, shall be thereafter deemed to be a public road forever, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as other public roads are directed to be kept in said county.
