next session of the General Assembly thereafter; Provided CHAP. 94. however, this act shall cease to have any effect, should said Prohibition Bank proceed to transact any other business than such as may be necessary to wind up the concerns of the same.

## CHAPTER 94.

An act to authorise the opening and extension of East street, Passed Feb. 10,1835 in the City of Annapolis, and to close up the Street now Rading from East to Prince George-street.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That George Wells, John W. Duvall, George McNier, Andrew Slicer, and William McParlin, be, and they are hereby appointed Commissioners, to open and extend East street, in the city of Annapolis, of its present width from the State House circle, and to extend the same to the water line of said city; and the said street, when so opened and extended, shall be deemed and taken, and is hereby declared to be a public street and highway forever hereafter, and the said Commissioners are hereby required to return a plot of Report plat the said street, when opened and extended, to the Clerk of the Corporation of the city of Annapolis, there to be filed.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the aforesaid Commissioners, or a majority of them, shall, after having given at least twenty days notice in the newspapers of the city of Annapolis, proceed to assess and value, upon oath, what damages may be sustained, by any person or persons whatever, by opening and extending said street, and if any person or body corporate shall think himself, herself, or themselves aggrieved by the decision of said Commissioners, such person or body politic may, by petition, appeal to Appeal the next County Court of Anne Arundel county, and the Judges thereof are hereby authorised to review and correct any decision made by said Commissioners.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the said street shall not previous payment be extended or opened through the property of any individual injured thereby, until the damages by t em sustained and assessed as aforesaid, shall be paid or tendered in pay-

ment.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That in case the obstruc- Removal of obtions in the said street are not removed within sixty days
