CHAPTER 94.

*An act to authorise the opening and extension of East street,* Passed Feb. 10, 1835  
*in the City of Annapolis, and to close up the Street now*  
*leading from East to Prince George-street.*

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Ma-* Commissioners  
*ryland,* That George Wells, John W. Duvall, George Mc- named  
 Nier, Andrew Slicer, and William McParlin, be, and they And authorised  
 are hereby appointed Commissioners, to open and extend High way  
 East street, in the city of Annapolis, of its present width from  
 the State House circle, and to extend the same to the water  
 line of said city; and the said street, when so opened and ex-  
 tended, shall be deemed and taken, and is hereby declared  
 to be a public street and highway forever hereafter, and the  
 said Commissioners are hereby required to return a plot of Report plat  
 the said street, when opened and extended, to the Clerk of  
 the Corporation of the city of Annapolis, there to be  
 filed.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the aforesaid Commis- Assess damages  
 sioners, or a majority of them, shall, after having given at  
 least twenty days notice in the newspapers of the city of  
 Annapolis, proceed to assess and value, upon oath, what  
 damages may be sustained, by any person or persons what-  
 ever, by opening and extending said street, and if any  
 person or body corporate shall think himself, herself, or  
 themselves aggrieved by the decision of said Commis-  
 sioners, such person or body politic may, by petition, appeal Appeal  
 to the next County Court of Anne Arundel county, and the  
 Judges thereof are hereby authorised to review and correct  
 any decision made by said Commissioners.

 ment.
