to the same fees for their services, which are allowed by the CHAP. 121.

Sec. 19 And be it enacted, That the measures or instru-Instruments provments, to be used by the inspector or measurer, shall be annually tried and proved, as weights and measures are now required to be, in the several counties of this state.

Sec. 20. And be it enacted, That the measurer of coal, compensation shall be entitled to one fourth of a cent, for measuring every bushel of coal, to be paid by the purchaser of the same.

CHAPTER 121.

An act to alter and amend the lines dividing the Seventh Passed Feb. 20,1335 and Eighth Election Districts, in Baltimore county.

WHEREAS, it hath been represented to this General As-Freamble sembly, that much inconvenience is experienced by the voters of Baltimore county, residing in the eighth election district, in consequence of the remoteness of the place of holding the election in said district, and that a change in the location of part of said district, would greatly promote their convenience and the public good, the prayer of the petitioners appearing reasonable and just, Therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Lines changed a part of the eight election district in Baltimore county, be added to the seventh district, according to the following lines viz. beginning at E. Rider's Mill, on the present divisional line of said district, running north to the ninth mile stone on the York turnpike, thence to Ridgely's furnace road; where it will intersect the said divisional line, and it shall and may be lawful for all voters now residing within the present lines of the eighth district, and within the limits of the aforesaid lines as above directed to be run, to vote at the place of holding the elections in the seventh election district, at all future elections.
