CHAPTER 182.

An act for the benefit of Joseph Hucheson, Sheriff of Worcester County. Passed Mar. 12, 1835

Sec 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, that the Levy court of Worcester county, be and they hereby are, authorised and required to pay to Joseph Hucheson, sheriff of Worcester county, such sum as they may think just and right, as an additional compensation, for extraordinary services performed by him, in holding an election in said county, in May last, for a representative to the Congress of the United States, to supply a vacancy occasioned by the death of Littleton P. Dennis, Esquire. Compensation

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That such allowance as shall be made by the Levy court aforesaid, be paid out of the surplus funds now in the hands of the collector of the taxes of Worcester county. Where derived
