

person to be sent to the alms house of the county to which such person belongs, or to a hospital, or some other place, better suited, in the judgment of the said court, to the condition of such lunatic or insane person, there to be confined at the expense of the county, or Baltimore city, as the case may be, until he or she shall have recovered and been discharged by a course of law: *Provided*, that nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent the friends or relatives of such lunatic or insane person from confining, or providing for the comfort of the same.

CHAPTER 195.

*An act supplementary to an act, passed at December session, passed Mar. 13, 1835 eighteen hundred and thirty-two, chapter one hundred and fifty eight, entitled, an act to lay out and open a Road in Frederick and Baltimore Counties.*

WHEREAS, a law was passed by the Legislature at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, chapter one hundred and fifty-eight, appointing four commissioners to lay out and open a Road, commencing at some point near Philip Nicodemus' Mill, in Frederick county, and running, by the nearest and most practicable route, to the Deer Park Road, in Baltimore county, near Frizzle's Blacksmith's Shop; that three of the commissioners, in compliance with said law, proceeded to lay out and open said road, which was done in part, when it was discovered that the location of the road might be advantageously changed, and that the acts of the commissioners were illegal, inasmuch as the provisions of said law required that the whole four should act;—Therefore,

Preamble

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Benjamin Gotsch and Joshua Solomon, of Baltimore county, and Philip Nicodemus, of Frederick county, be, and the same are hereby appointed commissioners, or a majority of them, to review, and if the public convenience, in their opinion, requires it, to survey, lay out, and open a road, not exceeding thirty feet in width, commencing at Philip Nicodemus' Mill, in Frederick county, to a point near the boundary tree of the beginning of a tract of land called Rich Meadows, and thence on the best grounds to a point on the Deer Park road, near its intersection, by a
