CHAPTER 223.

Passed Mar. 13, 1835	<i>An act directing the Levy Court of Prince George's County,</i>
	<i>to pay to the Messenger of the County Court of said</i>
	<i>County, the sum of money therein mentioned.</i>
Levy	<i>Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That</i>
	the justices of the Levy Court of Prince George's County
	be, and they are hereby authorised and directed to levy and
	assess upon the assessable property of said county, for the
	use of Benjamin Simpson, the messenger to the County
	Court of said county, such sum of money as the Levy
Compensation	Court may think proper and just, not exceeding the sum
	of one hundred and fifty dollars, as a compensation
	for the services of the said Simpson, as messenger as afore-
	said, from the date of his appointment as such, to the third
	Monday in May, eighteen hundred and thirty-four, and that
	the said sum of money shall be levied, collected, and paid,
	to the order of said Simpson, as other county charges are
	levied, collected, and paid, and shall be taken and consider-
	ed as a full compensation for his services rendered during
	the period aforesaid, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
