

CHAP. 231. his discretion, appoint and remove at pleasure, either one or two clerks to assist him in the discharge of his duties, any thing in the third section of the said original act, to the contrary notwithstanding: *Provided always*, that each clerk, before he acts as such, shall take the oath therein directed.

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the salary by the fourth section of the said original act, provided for the compensation of his clerk, may by the said Treasurer be paid to such one or two clerks as he shall employ, and in such proportions as to him shall seem proper.

CHAPTER 230.

Passed Mar. 10, 1835 *An act to provide for completing a New Map and Geological Survey of this State.*

Act continued in force

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the act of the General Assembly, entitled, an act to provide for making a new and complete map and a geological survey of this state, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and thirty three, chapter one hundred and thirty eight, shall be and the same is hereby re-enacted, to continue in force until the objects thereof are accomplished.

Contingent expenses

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the contingent expenses of the surveys directed by this act, shall be adjusted and allowed by the Governor and Council, and paid out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

CHAPTER 231.

Passed Mar. 10, 1835 *An act to establish a Market and build a Market House in the Town of Cumberland, in Allegany County, and for the regulation of the same.*

Preamble

WHEREAS, the erecting of a Market House in the Town of Cumberland will be attended with great convenience to the inhabitants thereof, and to the inhabitants of Allegany county, and other adjacent counties, and the same has been prayed for by the petition of a large number of subscribers living in said town, Therefore—
