missioners of the said town of Vienna to the person or persons entitled thereto.

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That the above named commiss oath required sioners or a majority of them, before they proceed to carry into effect the provisions of this act: shall take an oath before some justice of the peace in and for said county, faithfully and truly to value and assess said damages, to the best of their judgement.

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, That any person or Appeal persons whatsoever, who may think himself herself or themselves aggrieved by the decision of said commissioners: such person or persons may by petition appeal to the next county court of Dorchester county and the judges thereof are hereby authorised to examine and correct any judgment or decision made by said commissioners, and the appellant shall be entitled to a trial by jury; provided he, she or they, shall demand the same.

CHAPTER 13.

An act prohibiting Justices of the Peace from exercising their Passed Ian. 20, 1835 civil duties in bar rooms of taverns, or other public houses of that character, so far as relates to Baltimore county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Ma-Case of violation ryland, That from and after the first day of May next, any justice or justices of the peace in and for said county, who shall be found engaged in the discharge of his or their duties as justice or justices of the peace in civil matters in a bar room of a tavern or public house of that character, upon satisfactory information given within six months after the violation of this act to the grand jury of said county it shall be the duty of said grand jury to report the fact to the State's attorney or his deputy, who shall proceed and recover from the offender or offenders against this act, the sum of penalty twenty dollars with cost for each and every offence one half of the fine to be paid to the informant and the other half to be paid over to the treasurer of Baltimore county for the
