to the members of the company under his command, and CHAP. 251. take their several bonds by which they shall obligate them. Taking boad selves severally, and not jointly, to keep the arms and accoutrements so by them respectively received, in good order, and to re-deliver the same in like order when legally demanded or directed, under the penalty of fifteen dollars, to be severally paid by each obligor, who shall not perform conditions said duty; and it shall be the duty of the commanding officer of every uniform company of militia, to take a similar bond Also of wasterm from the members of his company, for the sate keeping and re-delivery of the arms and accourrements that he shall receive from the State and distribute or deliver to them.

Sec. 16 And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of Return of arms every member of a uniform or draughted company, when he is about to retire, or be discharged therefrom, to deliver, in good order, the arms and accoutrements belonging to the State, which he had received, to the commanding officer of his company, who shall receipt therefor, in duplicate, which receipt shall or may be pleaded as a discharge of

said members' bond.

Sec. 17. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of Duty of offeer to the commanding officer of every uniformed and draughted rule of aims company of militia, to order every member, who is about to retire, or to be discharged from the company under his command, to re-deliver to him the arms and accoutrements belonging to the State, which such member had received and had not returned; and in case any person shall refuse or neglect to comply with such order, for more than four days after he shall be notified thereof, the commanding officer, who gave the order, shall forthwith certify such neglect or refusal to the sheriff of his county, who shall there- when the upon proceed to make and collect, in the name and to the use of the State, the sum of fifteen dollars, from such de-who shall proceed linquent, by the same means, and in the same mode and to its dollars manner, that he would or might adopt or pursue, to make the sum of any judgment debt, upon an execution issued to enforce the same.

Sec. 18. And be it enacted, That the Governor and Executive author-Council shall, from time to time, adopt such measures, and give such orders, as they shall deem necessary, for the collection, preservation, distribution, delivery, and re-delivery, of the arms, accoutrements, and ammunition, belonging to this State; and provide and issue such ammunition as, in their opinion, may at any time be necessary; and to draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore for the cost and ex-
