

bilities of the office thereby vacated, until the same shall be supplied.

Sec. 31. *And be it enacted*, That each commissioned officer or the militia of this State, shall take the following oath or affirmation, in addition to the oath prescribed by the constitution:—I, A. B. do swear or affirm, as the case may be, that I will be true and faithful to the State of Maryland, and that I will diligently and faithfully do and perform the several duties assigned me as a member of the militia of the State of Maryland, according to the best of my skill and abilities; so help me God, and I certify, that I have done so, shall be certified in writing to my commission by the person who may have issued it, and that it is my duty to lay it before the commanding officer of my company, or detachment, after the publication of this act, and to have it signed and countersigned by said commanding officer, and then to have it certified by the Adjutant General, when he shall report the same, or hereafter, as he may be directed, or within thirty days after the same has been certified and is countersigned by the commanding officer, and when the same is countersigned by every commissioned officer belonging to my company, and when said oath or affirmation shall be reported to the Adjutant General, when he shall report the same, or hereafter, as he may be directed, or within thirty days after the same is countersigned by every commissioned officer belonging to my company, and if any officer shall refuse to take, or refuse to comply with the provisions of this section, or may be cashiered and struck from the rolls, he shall be fined one thousand dollars, or fined not exceeding five hundred dollars, at the discretion of such commanding officer, or commanding officer, which fine shall be collected and paid into the treasury of the proper county, as other fines are directed to be in this act.

Sec. 32. *And be it enacted*, That when any person, a member of the militia of this State, is lawfully called, or sent into actual service, every person belonging to my company, who is not a commissioned officer, shall be bound to obey his orders to serve in my place, or to go in my stead, and to furnish a substitute, which said substitute shall be appointed by the commanding, or commanding officer of the battalion, or detachment to which he shall belong; but if he may, for any time being, be disabled by sickness, shall neglect, or refuse to serve in my place, such sufficient substitute, in his place, within ten days after notice given to him, the captain, or commanding officer of the battalion, or squadron to which said defendant belongs, shall, and he is hereby required, to provide him, or procure, on as reasonable terms as may be, a sum or sums, such person so refusing or neglecting, and so doing, to pay such sum or sums, together with reasonable expenses for procuring, or
