See, 52. *Ad quodlibet enact.* That any officer, non-commissioned officer, musician or private, of the militia of this State, who shall be disabled while in the service of this State, shall, as a remuneration for the injury that he may have received, be entitled to half pay; and the same shall be paid to him by the Treasurer of the Western Shore, in the manner and under the regulations prescribed for like cases, payment directed to and by an act of the General Assembly, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and fourteen, chapter one hundred and four.

See, 53. *Ad quodlibet*, in addition to the many other alterations, changes which would result from making a uniform regulation for the citizens, by adopting a State uniform. Therefore do I enact, That the uniform for the militia of this State, to consist, for general officers, their coats, facings, and collars, grey-blue, long dark blue coat, faced with grey-blue, and grey-blue cuffs, yellow buttons and bell under cuffs, long breeches and chapeaux-de-bras for field company and staff officers, long dark blue coat, edged with red, red collars and cuffs, yellow buttons, dark blue pantaloons, edged with red or white, and white for summer; black gaiters, or high boots, and grey Abdoras and black coquade; for non-commissioned officers, and privates, short dark blue coat, red cuffs and breeches, white buttons, blue pantaloons, black gaiters, or high boots; a drummer, dark green frock or fluting shirt, and trousers; for cavalry, short coat, and pantaloons of dark blue cloth, edged with red, long hair boots, a helmet, or cap of leather, such as are worn by the United States Dragoon; for artillery, long dark blue coats, faced with red, red collars and cuffs, yellow buttons, blue pantaloons, black gaiters, or high boots, and chapeaux-de-bras.

See, 54. *Ad quodlibet*. That the Governor, by and with the consent of the Council, for the accommodation and support of the militia at any time called into actual service, may appoint such commissaries and staff officers as may seem proper, and shall have power to adopt such measures as may be deemed necessary for procuring, transporting and issuing all requisite supplies; and said supplies shall be so provided for any militia called into actual service, the officer commanding them, shall have full power and authority to procure, transfer and issue necessary supplies to the corps under his command; and whenever calls are made upon the militia, by the governor, such calls shall be made
