

own body, as they may think proper, to be a quorum or committee for transacting all general, and necessary business of the said seminary, and managing rules for the management thereof, and also to make regulations for the direction and examination of the said seminary and the students therein; *Provided*, that the said ordinances be not repugnant to the constitutional laws of this State.

*Sec. 6. And be it enacted,* That the trustees and their successors, or a majority of them, shall meet at least twice in every year, in state semi annual meetings, to be appointed by their own ordinaries, and at such other times, as by their said ordinaries, or by their own appointments, they may direct; and when so assembled, they shall have power, from time to time, to appoint a President, Treasurer and Secretary; to make contracts with the professors or teachers relative to the instruction of the students to be placed under their care, and for the payment of their salaries; to examine the progress of the students; to hear and determine on all complaints and appeals, and upon all matters touching the discipline and government of the said Academy, and the execution of their ordinances, and generally to manage the state and concerns of the said seminary, in such manner as they shall deem best for the advantage of the institution.

## CHAPTER 259.

### *An act to Incorporate the Cokesbury Academy, in Harford County, Maryland.*

Whereas application has been made to this General Assembly of Maryland, for the passage of a law to incorporate Cokesbury Academy, in Harford County, Therefore:

*Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Augustus Bradford, W. G. D. Worthington, Stephen J. Raphael, Thomas J. Caldwell, Samuel Ricketts, George W. Hall, George Bradford, John C. Norris, Francis Dennis, Benedict F. Waters, David Rutledge, of Hampton, William Keyser, Doctor Julius Dalton, William Rubenstein, and Doctor James Rearring, be, and they are hereby appointed the first trustees of Cokesbury Academy, and the said trustees and their successors, shall be, and they are hereby declared to be one community, corporation and body
