Commissioners to report

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That William McMahan and Bene S. Pigman, of Allegany county, are hereby appointed commissioners, to join John Hoyer and Meshach Frost, and the said John Hoyer, Meshach Frost, William McMahan, and Bene S. Pigman, and the superintendant or other officer, for the time being, appointed by the President of the United States, or a majority of them, are hereby appointed commissioners to report the said National Road within the limits of this State, when, in their discretion, they shall deem proper, to the Governor and Council of this State, to enable the Executive to appoint a Superintendant, under the act, entitled, an act for the preservation and repair of that part of the United States Road, within the limits of the State of Maryland.

CHAPTER 268.

Passed Mar. 16, 1835

An act relating to the Franklin Turnpike Road.

Preamble

WHEREAS, the Franklin Turnpike Road has never been licensed in the manner provided for by the thirteenth section of an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Franklin Turnpike Road Company, and has been taken by taxation and sold at sheriff sale, to, and is now the property of persons who are desirous of having the same licensed under the said section;

Authority granted
Eleven trustees

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be lawful for John Glenn and Hugh Levey Evans, to apply to the Governor, in the same manner as the Franklin Turnpike Road Company might have done, to license the said road, and the same proceeding may be had thereupon, and the road may be licensed in the same manner and upon the same conditions as are directed in the thirteenth section of an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Franklin Turnpike Road Company.
