Certificate of sur-
vive

Sec. 2. *And be it enacted*, That at the end of each quarter of every year, from and after the passage of this act, it shall be the duty of the Clerk of Baltimore County Court, to certify to the Treasurer of Baltimore County, and to the Mayor and Register of the city of Baltimore, the amount of dues for such quarter of the said Crier and Bailiffs, respectively; and it shall thereupon be the duty of the said Treasurer, and of said Mayor and Register respectively, forthwith to pay the said dues in the proportions thereof, in which the dues of said Crier and Bailiffs are now by law payable respectively, by the city of Baltimore and by Baltimore County, out of the limits of the city.

CHAPTER 273.

Passed Mar. 13, 1835. *An act for the distribution by lot, of certain Real and Personal Estate.*

Preamble

WHEREAS, Mary Ann Coale, executrix and devisee of her deceased husband, Edward J. Coale, has represented to this General Assembly, that as such executrix and devisee, she is possessed of certain real and personal estate, and that there are creditors to a considerable amount, of her said husband, whose demands she cannot satisfy, without reducing to indigence herself and her children, unless she be authorised to dispose of by lot the said real and personal estate, which she cannot without great sacrifice otherwise dispose of; said real estate consisting of three tracts of land, respectively called "Morvan," "Condy," and "Fruitful Retreat," and a fourth, situate in Huntingdon county, in Pennsylvania; and said personal estate being, a ring set with diamonds, six shares of Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road stock, one share in the Baltimore Library Company, two paintings, and three hundred and sixty two volumes of books,

Section 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the said Mary Ann Coale, and her heirs and executors or administrators, be and they are hereby authorised to make a public sale, or distribution by lot or chance, of said real and personal estate, and to that end they shall by sufficient deed or deeds convey the same to David Hoffman and John G. Proud, and the survivor of them, to be held by them in trust, to be conveyed by them or the survivor, to
